


Task


The students used the theme of My Neighbourhood and the Art strand as their stimulus. They created observational drawings from their own photographs and from direct observation with the intention of completing a realised painting/drawing.

Background


The students started by exploring the themes and quickly picked My Neighbourhood. Preliminary sketches and photographs dictated the direction of each students work. This was followed by experimentation with various techniques and media, such as watercolour washes, oil pastel blending, acrylic impasto, pencil blending, etc. The development of their work was inspired the by their research of an artist. The students were encouraged to use elements from their paintings e.g., colour, composition, paint techniques in their realised work.








TEACHER ANNOTATION: The student explored the work of Van Gogh by trying to emulate the artist's techniques.






TEACHER ANNOTATION: The student's level of engagement was good throughout the CBA, as evidenced by their exploration and levels of achievement with a variety of media.
